FLOODING - John Huggins is to be congratulated for the works that he has carried out to his field by Slip Lane adjacent to the ditch that he previously dug. Small trees, hawthorn, field maple and hazel have been planted next to faggots of sticks by the edge of the field which should, in time, form a partial barrier to the water.

DOVER DISTRICT LOCAL PLAN - The public consultation period for the plan lasts for 6 weeks, finishing on the 17^{th of} March and the details can be found on their website www.doverdistrictlocalplan.co.uk. It is a well-designed site with a lot of information on but clicking 'Where I Live' and then' view proposed sites' will take you to a page with Alkham on. Land to the east of Short Lane is shown as an area for possible housing but this area was shown on their 2010 plan and there is the possible extension of the gypsy site at South Alkham. There are seven other headings which can be commented on.

TRUSTEES - Alkham Village Hall is held on a charitable trust by Trustees, who are its legal owners, on behalf of the Parish and the day to day running of the Hall is in the hands of a Management Committee. The main responsibilities of the Trustees are: 1. To deal with any matters arising with third parties from the legal ownership of the Hall. 2. To ensure that any proposals of the Management Committee do not run counter to the Charitable Trust upon which the Hall is held. 3. To comply with any requirements of the Charity Commission and to deliver to it an Annual Return. For legal reasons, the bare number of Trustees is two, but a comfortable number would be four. Due to the unfortunate demise of Clive, we are looking for at least one committed person in the village to take on the role of Trustee. Official appointment is by Deed and necessitates the transfer of ownership of the land, which is dealt with by a solicitor. FROM THE VICARAGE - As I write, it's a Sunday afternoon and I'm feeling slightly the worse for wear. No, I didn't have a wild night last night - but I did have my first Covid vaccination yesterday. Aspirin got me through two services this morning, and I'm telling myself that short-term pain is worth the long-term gain - which I'm sure it is. It was in March of last year, during Lent, that the first lockdown began and everything suddenly changed. Mothering Sunday services didn't happen; by Palm Sunday I was filming myself making paper palm crosses for others to try making at home; and the Easter Garden took shape on the vicarage driveway, hurriedly decorated with a tray of pansies from a supermarket. Most just shrivelled up in the spring sunshine, but a couple of them seemed to celebrate the hope and joy of Easter by not just surviving but blooming all the way into October. As I write, Lent is just about to begin. Forty days and nights, not just without cake, chocolate and other such things, but without things that usually make everyday life what it is. This Mothering Sunday will probably be another of those occasions when we would normally be with family and friends but may well end up sending flowers through the post and chatting on Skype instead. So here's some hope and encouragement for Lent: think of those pansies - they wouldn't have grown on the vicarage driveway had it not been for the pandemic. Perhaps in the same way, we'll look back on this time in

years to come and find that there are things that we've gained as well as lost – perhaps small things, like the pansies, easy to miss for the moment– but still growing, all the same. **Brian Williams**
