There have been more fraud related incidents reported this month.

I have engaged with our fraud officer, please see the below with fraud prevention advice:

The Police, your Bank or official body will never ask for you to -

- Give them your Bank Account details, card numbers, PIN's or Passwords.
- Will never ask you to take money out of your account for them to keep safe by sending a courier to collect it.
- The Police will never ask you to lie to your bank.
- The Police or HMRC will never ask you to pay a fine by purchasing Gift cards and giving them the voucher numbers.

If you get a telephone call, then ask them for their details – what department are they from, where are they based etc. Tell them that you will ring back. Wait at least 10 minutes or use an alternative phone to call or ask a friend/family member to use their phone.

NEVER call the number supplied over the phone by the caller.

- If they say they are the bank, HMRC etc call the number on the back of your bank card OR the number on the legitimate bank website.
- If it is the Police, then ring 101 and ask to speak to the officer by name.

All major phone companies provide a phone blocker service. This will help screen out most phone scams.

Remove yourself from the public phone directory and remove yourself from the public voter's roll. This will remove you from lists held by legitimate companies like 192.com, where people can find out your personal details.

If someone comes to your house advising you need work done/offer a service. Never agree to any work on the doorstep. Politely decline and close the door. If you are concerned work is required, use Trusted Traders and obtain at least three quotes. Never pay for work upfront and always get an invoice.

When shopping online, **NEVER** pay by a direct bank transfer. Only use reputable websites that you know and trust, make sure you see a padlock symbol when making a purchase, and where possible use a credit card which has insurance for online payments or pay using PayPal Goods & Services.

Beware of Phishing/Smishing. Never respond to unexpected emails or text messages, click on links or attachments, or provide bank details or personal information – no matter how tempting or convincing the message may seem. If you have received an email which you're not quite sure about, forward it to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS): *report@phishing.gov.uk*

Never allow someone to gain remote access to your PC in order to download software. Always install the latest software and app updates to protect your device.
